MISSION WARSAW, POLAND SUMMER 2022

from THE DEAD

Alex Jacob writes...

It's great when a plan finally gets put into practice. Our plans for a united outreach in Warsaw with participants from many nations and mission groups (see article in News and Views – Issue 4, 2022) was postponed twice due to covid and the conflict in Ukraine, but in August 2022 it went ahead with about 40 participants (plus support for a number of local Churches). We all worked well together in a range of outreach activities.

CMJUK played an active part in planning and delivering this outreach and 5 UK staff and 3 UK volunteers travelled to Warsaw, most of us flew but Paul and Janey had a long overland drive as they delivered many artefacts for the Bible Comes to Life exhibition which was an important part of the outreach.

For me (despite being sidelined with my first bout of Covid for 6 days) this outreach was very significant and I was privileged to share in it and to be part of a very hard working and creative team. It was also good to visit the site of the CMJ HQ in Warsaw – this site and the work was closed down as the Nazi regime invaded Poland in 1939. Maybe one day soon it will start again?

By order of the German occupat authorities, the ghetto w off from the rest on November 16, area, surrounded initially 307 hects with time, it was Starting in Januar divided in two large and small gh Approximately 360,000 Warsaw and 90,000 from other towns wer herded into the ghetto. Nearly 100,000 died of hunger. Duri the summer of 1942, the Germ deported and murdered close to 300,000 people in the gas chambers of Treblinka. On April 19, 1943, an uprising broke out in the ghetto. Until mid-May, fighters and civilians perished in combat or in the systematically burned ghetto buildings. The remaining population was murdered by Germans in November 1943 in the Majdanek, Poniatowa and Trawniki concentration camps Only a few survived. To the memory of those who

Inspiring and intensive 3-day training kick started a packed two-week outreach schedule, with a cross missional and multi-generational team of Jewish and Gentile volunteers from many nations, including the UK, USA, Israel, Germany, France, Ukraine, Russia, Hungary and Poland.

Polish, Ukrainian and Russian speakers helped us overcome language barriers at special events, including lectures, a concert for Holocaust survivors and rescuers, a garden party, and the Bible Comes to Life exhibition.

We worked in small teams, giving out around 158,000 tracts in total at various sites around Warsaw. As well as having thousands of conversations and making several hundred Jewish and Gentile contacts, we had the great joy of leading 86 people to faith, including three Jewish decisions.

I made a number of Jewish contacts, who were followed up by local teams in Poland and Israel, and had conversations with (mainly!) friendly and open Israeli tourists. Engaging with Gentiles of various faith backgrounds, I was able to lead some in faith commitments, sharing the gospel (using the God Tools App) in Polish, Ukrainian, Russian, Czech, Arabic and Punjabi! Here is a snapshot:

- A young man was waiting at a train station on his way home to Belarus. I shared the gospel and he gave his life to the Lord. He was worried about being sent to prison when he returned home for protesting against the government. I assured him that whatever happened he now belonged inseparably to the Lord, if he continued to trust in him.
- An asylum seeker was sitting in a park. I shared a
 gospel tract in his language and he prayed to ask
 Jesus into his life. Apparently, a minister had been
 sharing the gospel with him at an asylum centre –
 one sows, another reaps!
- A young woman from Georgia was sitting on a wall smoking. I approached her, offered a tract and asked what she had heard about Jesus. I shared the gospel in her language and, with emotion and conviction, she gave her life to the Lord.

In August we took the Bible Comes To Life Exhibition to Warsaw where we joined colleagues from CMJ-UK, CMJ-Israel and Jews for Jesus for a joint outreach event Warsaw. The first challenge was negotiating import and export we travelled overland as through the Netherlands Germany to Poland. Our life-size camel Jamal raised eyebrows Dutch with customs interest officials and gave us our first opportunity to talk about our faith and our reasons for travelling. Our venue was a beautiful old building near Warsaw's Old Town. We are



grateful for the help that several **Polish Christians** offered with translation work, day to day interpreting and setting-up of the exhibition. We opened during the day for nine days and on three evenings when specialist lectures that had been arranged as part of the outreach programme.

The beauty of the exhibition was the length of time people spent with us. The street teams made an amazing number of contacts but their conversations often lasted only a minute or two; whereas people visiting the exhibition often stayed for more than 2 hours. That gave us opportunity to witness at length.

We recorded visitors from Poland, Ukraine, Russia, Germany, Norway, UK, US, Sudan, Somalia, Jordan and Israel; Protestants, Catholics including a nun, Jews, Muslims and secular people. One of our visitors was the Pastor of a large Baptist Church who invited us to talk about the exhibition at their Sunday service. There was a lot of interest in some CMJ's past workers - Michael Solomon Alexander, Elizabeth (McCaul) Finn, Samuel Schor and Jacob Jocz who all have family connections to Poland. The recurring theme of our time in Warsaw was that the Lord wants to redeem CMJ's unfinished Polish ministry. We value your prayers as we explore what this means for us.



THINKING ALOUD! by Alex Jacob


This time last year I was in the middle of my sabbatical and about to embark on an Advent retreat. To the surprise and amusement of many who know me well this retreat was a silent retreat!

As I re-read my notes from this retreat (hosted by the Martha and Mary Centre in Devon) I came across these jottings from the book – The Blue Mountains of China by Rudy Wiebe (published by McClelland & Stewart, 1995). The book stated- "There can be a false and detached innocence of not being involved, in not taking sides or making choices and decisions. But this is not the way of the Kingdom. The Kingdom brings a

new way of living in which you repent by not feeling bad but by thinking and doing differently, you show wisdom by trusting others, you lead by serving and you respond to offenders by forgiving – in fact you develop a new attitude and new actions in everything – in nature, the state, politics, economics, family, work and leisure. This is the reality of being truly part of the "Jesus society".

For me these words seem like a very good overview of Gospel living - Gospel living which for me is a bit like a silent retreat, something of a struggle but worth preserving with!
